A YEAR IN REVIEW

1ST QUARTER - OCTOBER 2022 - DECEMBER 2022



October Introductions - GCYLC Council Members formally introduced themselves to the Board of Commissioners and community at the October 17th commissioner meeting.

Leadership Retreat - Council members came together for a 2-day leadership retreat at Camp Oak Hill. Members were able to do various team building activities, while also enhancing their leadership skills through learning program development, parliamentary procedure and analyzing community data.











Official Council Meeting - The Council held it's first official council meeting in December. Members went through the full agenda of items, got headshots taken, held elections, reviewed county boards and created their logo.





2ND QUARTER- JANUARY 2023 - MARCH 2023

School Board Presentation - GCYLC Chair, Jermaine Puryear Jr. along with Vice Chair, Elaina Eley made a public comment to the Granville County School Board to inform them of the council's purpose and the hope for future partnership.





Focus Group - The Council participated in a youth focus group with the Granville County Parks, Greenways and Recreation Advisory Committee to share their experiences in Granville County and ideas for the future.

Student Needs Survey - Council members created a needs assessment to help determine key priorities for their youth-led projects. The survey was geared toward high-school students and asked students of their ideas, challenges, and needs. Council members tabled at various local high schools and surveyed over 200 students. The survey indicated that mental health, substance use and fighting were key challenges facing high school students today.



Project Planning - The Council decided to prioritize and focus on teen mental health. A subcommittee of members began brainstorming ways to support and educate their peers on mental health.

A YEAR IN REVIEW

3RD QUARTER - APRIL 2023 - JUNE 2023

County Boards - Council members served on various county boards and committees. Each month, members would report out on the meetings they attended and what relevant information was discussed. Some of these boards include;

- Human Relations, Library Board of Trustees, Juvenile Crime and Prevention Council, Animal Control Advisory and the Veteran's Affairs Committee.
- Members also attended GCPS School Board and Board of County Commissioner meetings.

CultureFest 2023 - Council members set up an interactive information booth at this year's CultureFest to inform the community of the council and their mental health initiatives. The booth allowed space for community members of all ages to play interactive games about mental health and win prizes. The group expressed that mental health was not only important for adults, but also youth in our community.





Civic Leadership Training - Council members participated in a Civic Leadership bootcamp where they built foundational support for youth to become civically engaged in the process of participatory democracy, living within a community of competing values and interests and working to find common ground for the common good. The learned about local government and their role as youth leaders.



4TH QUARTER-JULY 2023 - SEPTEMBER 2023

Teen Mental Health First Aid Training (tMHFA) - Council members participated in a 3-week training at the Poe Center in Raleigh, NC and learned about the various ways to approach situations that involve their peers and mental health obstacles. They now have the knowledge on how to notice and support a friend or peer experiencing a mental health or substance use challenge and be a bridge or buffer for them to connect with an adult. Members that attended the training are certified through the National Council of Mental Wellbeing until they are 18 years of age.

GCYLC Reflections - Council members spent some time reflecting on their first year and provided feedback on what they learned, enjoyed and would like to do next. Members rated participation in community events as their favorite activity. Majority of members reported learning new things during county board meetings and YLC activities.
